Demand Control Schema (DCS) is a framework that incorporates factors that interpreters need to consider to assist with ethical decision making and professional conduct within interpreting practice. This framework will be explained and applied to interpreting scenarios, including educational settings, with the opportunity for interpreters to consider their own experiences and upcoming interpreting assignments within this model.

Aim of the course:

To provide a framework to enable interpreters to understand how the DC-S framework relates to their interpreting practise.

Outcomes:

To articulate and apply the factors of the DC-S framework to all facets of their professional practise.
